WALK FROM THE CRICKETERS, GUILDFORD – 2 MAY 2022

Spring has sprung forth this month with everything bursting out all over in a big way, lambsies are jumping, bluebells are out and the trees are now in their full glory. The only drawback that goes with the improving weather is, can you get over Hampton Court Bridge, as the installation of protective barriers seems to be going on and on. Somehow our thirteen Probus walkers still made the 10 a.m. deadline at the Cricketers PH just to the west of Guildford and we welcomed back Sue Spraggs and her dog Pepper after a long absence. Sue was unfortunately involved in a collision with a woman in a great hurry at Bentalls in Kingston who knocked her flying to the ground which resulted in a broken pelvis. Sue had only popped in for a pair of tights but ended up with a long recovery time from her injury. She did manage our 4ml walk OK, maybe Pepper dragged her along. The winter rains have dried out now, so the ground was quite firm underfoot as we followed the power line path through the woods to the open fields beyond.
